CONFERENCE VENUES

All the venues for the EFN Conference and EEx are in the area called the Northern Quarter, in easy walking distance of each other and close to tram stops.

Wednesday 18 – there will be an informal meet-up for people arriving on Wednesday between 19.00 and 21.00. We will let you know the address of the venue by email near to the date.

TRAVEL

TRAVEL FROM MANCHESTER AIRPORT TO THE VENUES:

Airport to Halle St Michaels

Take the Dark Blue (Navy) tram line to **Market Street** – it is a 5 minute walk from there to Halle St Michaels at George Leigh Street M4 5DG

Airport to Stoller Hall

Take the Dark Blue (Navy) tram line to **Victoria** tram stop – it is a short (4 minutes) walk from there to the Stoller Hall, Hunts Bank M3 1DA



GENERAL TRAVEL

In Manchester the best way to travel is by tram.

Taxis – the classic black taxi cabs - are also good and easy to find in central Manchester and not too expensive.

Travel from Manchester Airport to central Manchester

The very simplest, easiest and cheapest way to travel to the centre of the city is to catch a tram from Manchester Airport.

Take the Dark Blue (Navy) tram line (if necessary you can ask advice on which stop to get off at or which stop to change at from officials at the tram stop). Buy a ticket on the tram platform.

The tram journey to central stops in the centre is almost 60 minutes – but that is not much longer than a taxi with no traffic – and taxi fares from the airport will be high– as much as £60 GBP – *so the tram is best!*

Travel from Manchester Piccadilly Rail Station

The station is in the centre of the city. Its own tram stop is underneath the station and it is also very close to other tram stops – you might need a different tram stop so check which line you need.

From the station approach (outside the main doors of the station) there are free buses (no charge) on circular routes around many places in the city centre. There are officials to help you find the best bus to take and where to get off.

The taxi rank is at the back of the station – go down the elevator at the back of the concourse. Taxis are frequent and not so expensive in the city centre.
